

PHOTOGRAPHY AND VIDEOGRAPHY

A wedding at St. Andrew's is a festive liturgy first and foremost and should be treated with dignity. Therefore, the following guidelines must be followed.

- Photographer must finish shooting inside the Cathedral at least 45 minutes before the service begins.
- If photos are to be taken after the service, **the photographer must conclude all photographs on the premises within 20 minutes of the end of the service.** If a photo of the priest and acolytes is desired, it should be the first picture taken after the wedding.
- No flash photography is permitted during the service.
- Available-light photographs may be taken during the wedding, but the photographer must remain in the rear of the church and use a camera with an unpronounced shutter sound.
- **One flash picture (and only one)** may be taken from the rear of the church as the couple leaves the Cathedral.
- **No photos or videos may be taken by guests in the pews.**
- A videotape of the wedding may be made from the back of the center aisle. TV monitors, lights and cabling of any kind may not be used. Microphones on the wedding party are not allowed.
- It is the responsibility of the couple to inform family and friends as to the rules of St. Andrew's Cathedral concerning photography during the service.
- The Cathedral reserves the right to use any wedding photographs in its possession, whether taken by authorized Cathedral personnel or submitted to the Cathedral by the wedding party, for promotional or other purposes.

A signed copy of the Cathedral Guidelines should be returned to the Wedding Coordinator at the couple's earliest convenience.
