Throughout January & February

For this season after the Epiphany we are hosting weekly home Eucharists to gather together to enjoy one another's company, to share in the Eucharist, and to engage in conversations about our commitment to Christ and our engagement with the Cathedral.

Reflection and conversation about who we are and where we're headed is a normal, healthy practice for churches. After three years of a pandemic, national polarizing political anxiety, forceful renewed calls for racial justice, concerns about the viability of our downtown, it's really important for the St. Andrew's family to be in conversation about our future. Framing that parish conversation via our baptismal covenant—how we are loved by God and how we are to love each other, in community—just makes sense because it is the first promise we make to each other as Christians. These conversations will help us understand how we are to “live into our baptism” more fully as individuals and as a community.

Evensong in St. Patrick's Cathedral, tea in the gardens of Brigid, guided cliff walk from Doolin to the Cliffs of Moher, are all included in a pilgrimage led by Anne Maxwell and Tommy Dillon on July 18th through the 28th.
