Letter From the Dean

Darkness is the beginning and the end. Advent begins with scary, apocalyptic, words describing a time when the sun will not light the day nor the moon the night. This season will end with Shepherds tending sheep in fields covered in darkness of night. Sounds like a good Scorsese

film. But what about the star, and the angels that will light up the night? The psalm says of God, "Darkness is not dark to you; the night is as bright as the day; darkness and light to you are both alike." (Ps. 139:11) Darkness can be a quieting, a time of stillness, in which to wait, to catch our breath, to experience transition in a pace that allows our head and heart to catch up.
