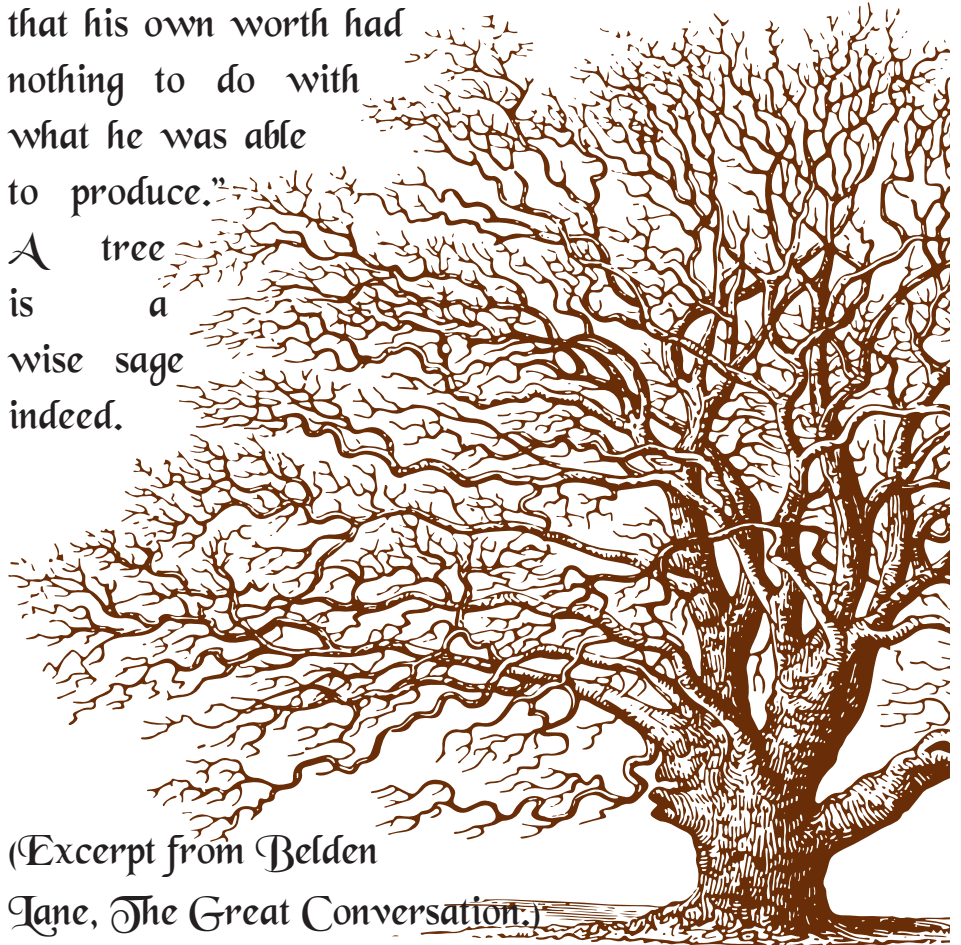
From a 4th century story:

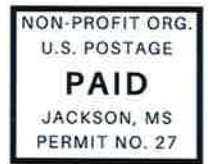
