Letter From the Dean

Adult Formation is bigger than Sunday morning. It's about discipleship, which has less to do with learning the right thing to think, and everything to do with orienting ourselves to a different

way of being. That's tough to do in just 50 minutes on Sunday!

Eric Law describes profound change as something that combines a person's inner aspirations, values, and behaviors with external systems and priorities. Latin meaning foundational, profound change is moving toward the foundational which necessitates a process of learning. It is not about doing something different (attending a class), but about developing a capacity for doing things in a new way, becoming a disciple of Christ.

The whole of Sunday morning is a crucial part of our formation. From greeting someone at the front door - biblical hospitality, to kneeling in the presence of the Creator, to singing with praise to God, to receiving the body and blood of Christ, to offering a cup of lemonade to a child who can't quite reach, or a cookie to a homeless guest who isn't quite sure they are welcome. Week after week we show up and take part.

Adult Formation is about the whole person in body, mind, and spirit, and time made sacred, not because it is Sunday morning in church, but because it is

Joyfully proclaiming the gospel of Jesus Christ through grace-filled worship, radical hospitality, and incarnational faith.

Children can wear their costumes to church at the 10:30am service to receive a blessing, and then stay after church for a Halloween Festival for all ages in the Parish Hall!


