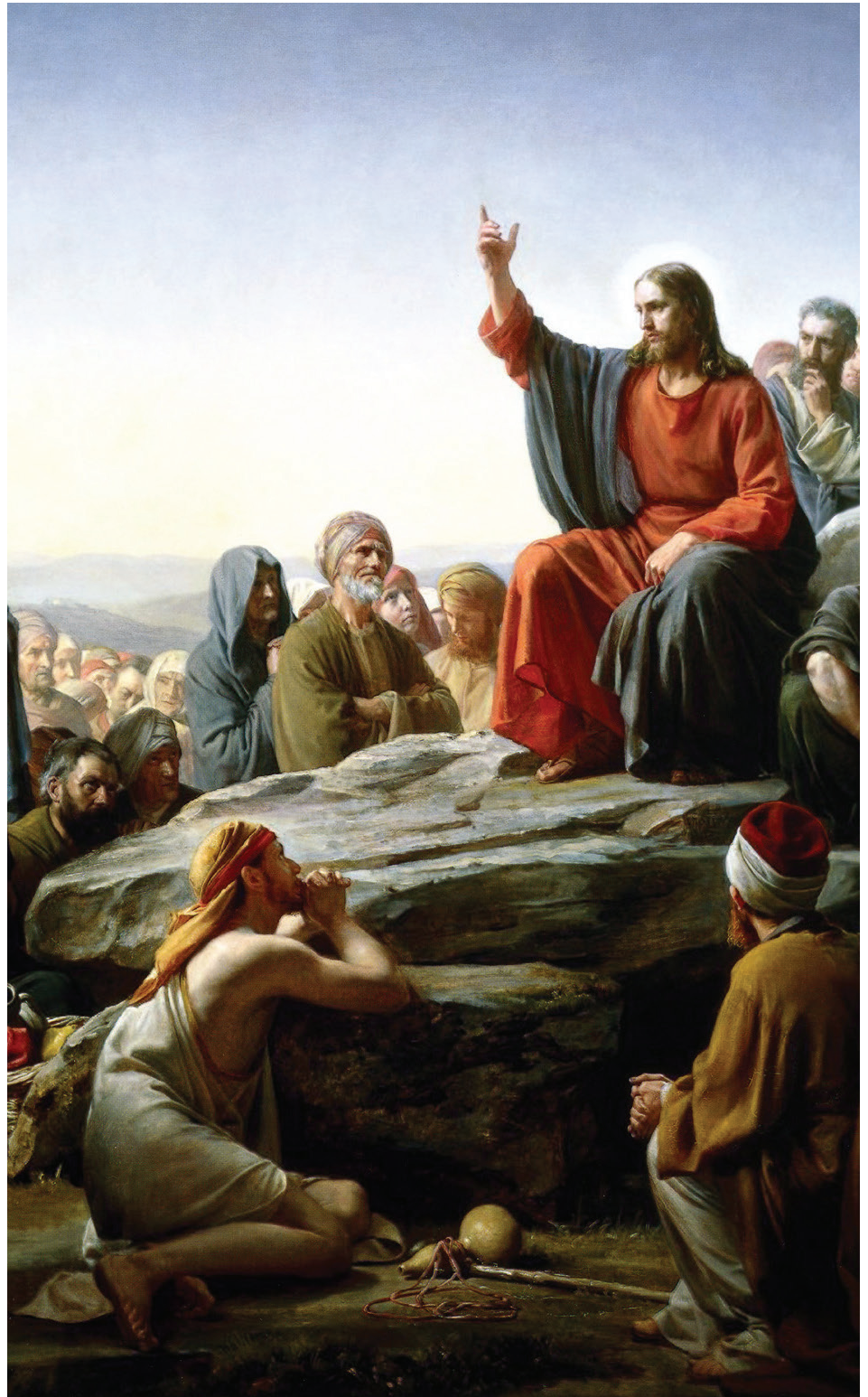

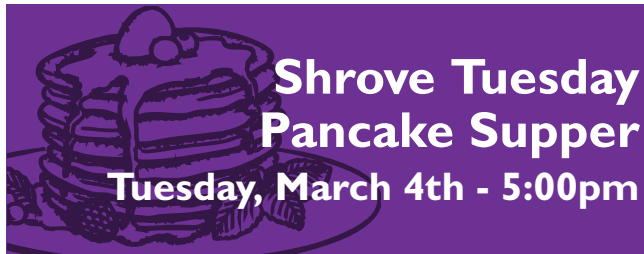


Immigration Forum

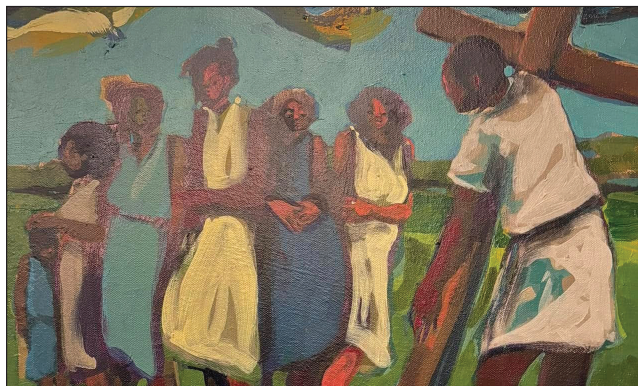
Food Pantry Sunday

Penitents Welcome

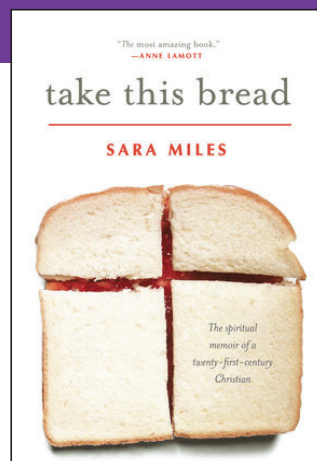
