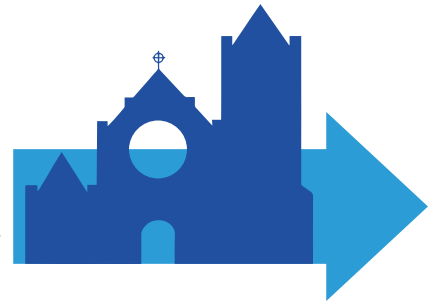

Parish Picnic

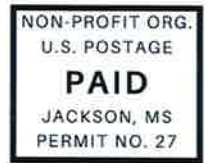
